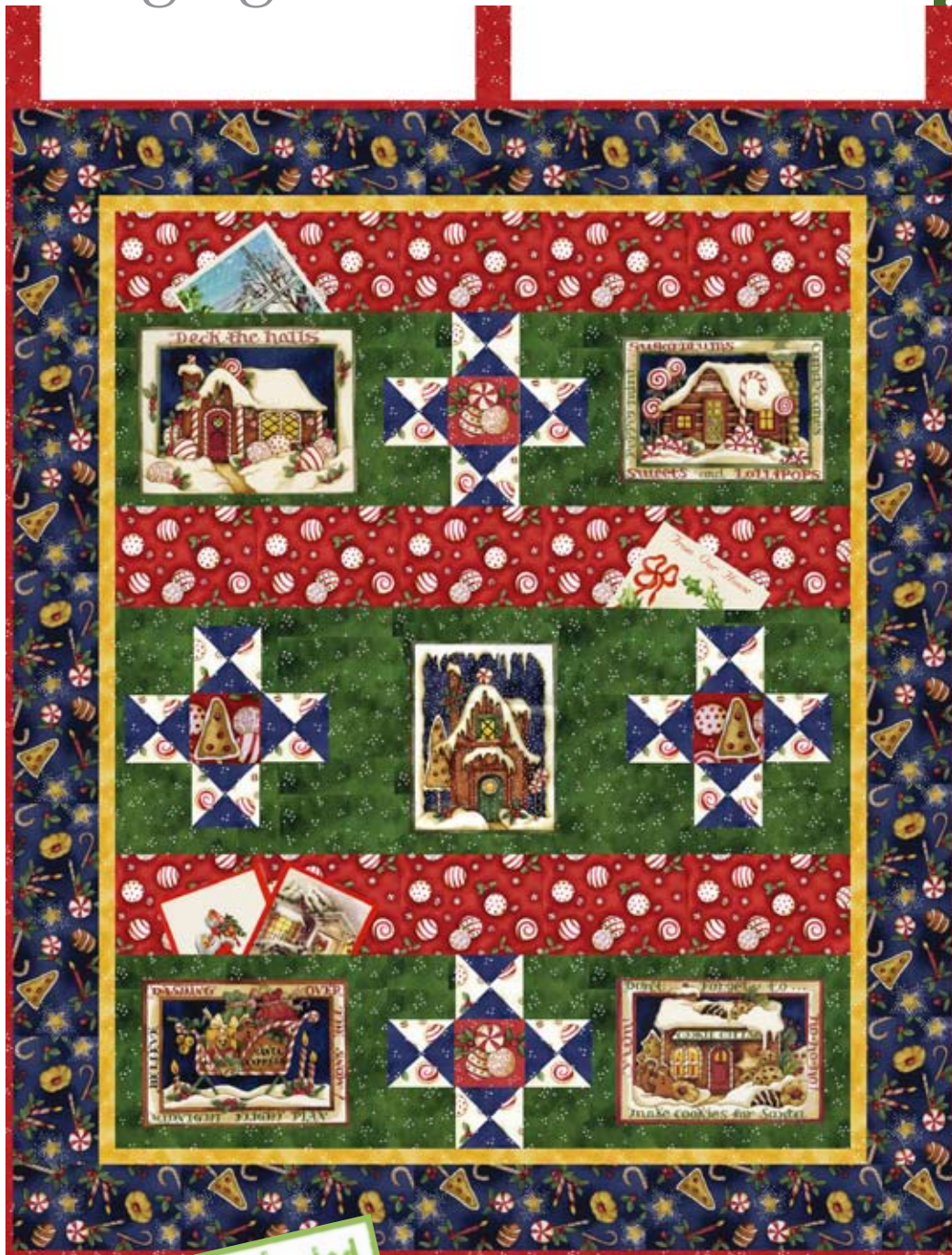

Materials

Yardages based on 42" wide fabric

- 1-1/3 Yards - Green Dots (Y0198-3)
- 1 Panel - Peppermint Panel (Y0196-1)
- 1/8 Yard - Blue Dots (Y0198-2)
- 1/8 Yard - White Peppermints (Y0201-5)
- 1 Yard - Red Peppermints (Y0201-1)
- 1/4 Yard - Yellow Dots (Y0198-4)
- 1/2 Yard - Blue Treats (Y0200-2)
- 1/2 Yard - Red Dots (Y0198-1)
- 1-1/3 Yard - Red Gingerbread Men (Y0199-1)

Cut the Fabrics

WOF = Width of Fabric
LOF = Length of Fabric

From the Green Dots Print cut:

- 5 – 2-1/2" x WOF strips, crosscut into:

- 16 – 2-1/2" x 8" strips
- 16 – 2-1/2" squares

- 2 – 1-1/2" x 22-1/2" strips
- 2 – 6-1/2" x 22-1/2" strips
- 1 – 8-1/2" x 22-1/2" strips
- 2 – 3-1/2" x 7" strips

From the Peppermint Panel cut:

- Fussy cut four horizontal images and one vertical image including 1/4" seam allowance outside the printed frames.
- Fussy cut four 2-1/2" squares, centering each on a candy motif.

From the Blue Dots cut:

- 8 – 3-1/2" squares

From the White Peppermints cut:

- 8 – 3-1/2" squares

From the Red Peppermints cut:

- 2 – 9-1/2" x 22-1/2" strips
- 1 – 11-1/2" x 22-1/2" strip

From the Yellow Dots cut:

- 2 – 1" x 29-1/2" strips
- 2 – 1" x 23-1/2" strips

From the Blue Treats cut:

- 2 – 3-1/2" x 30-1/2" strips
- 2 – 3-1/2" x 29-1/2" strips

From the Red Dots cut:

- 3 – 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" strips
- 4 – 2-1/2" x WOF strips for Binding

From the Red Gingerbread Men cut:

- 1 – 37" x 44" piece for the backing

Directions

Star Block Assembly:

- 1) Place one 3-1/2" blue dot square on top of one 3-1/2" white peppermint square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line to make two half-square triangles (Fig. 2).
- 2) Trim the blocks to measure 2-7/8" square.
- 3) Place one half-square triangle from Step 1 on top of another half-square triangle, right sides together. Make sure the center seam is going in the same direction on both half-square triangles and the blue dot triangle in the top block is opposite from the white peppermint triangle in the bottom block.
- 4) Draw a diagonal line across the top half-square triangle so that it goes through the sewn seam. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the drawn line (Fig. 3). Cut on the drawn line to make two quarter-square triangles (Fig. 4).
- 5) Repeat Steps 1-4 to make sixteen quarter-square triangles. Trim (if needed) to 2-1/2" square.
- 6) Refer to the quilt photo and sew together four quarter-square triangles, four 2-1/2" green dot squares and one 2-1/2" candy square to make one pieced block. Repeat to make four pieced star blocks total.

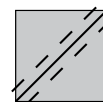

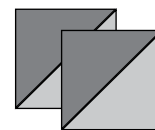

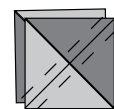

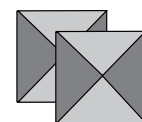

Card Pocket Assembly:

- 1) Sew one 2-1/2" x 8" green dot strip to the top and bottom of each of the four horizontal images. Trim the ends of each strip even with the centers. Sew one 2-1/2" x 8" green dot strip to each side of the centers. Trim each framed block to measure 6-1/2" high x 8-1/2" wide.
- 2) Sew one framed block to each side of one pieced star block to make the pocket front for the top row. Repeat to make the pocket front for the bottom row.
- 3) Sew one 3-1/2" x 7" green dot strip to the left and right sides of the vertical image. Trim this framed block as needed to measure 6-1/2" tall x 10-1/2" wide.
- 4) Sew one pieced star block to each side of the vertical framed block to make the middle row. Sew one 1-1/2" x 22-1/2" green dot strip to the top and bottom of the middle row to complete.
- 5) Place one 6-1/2" x 22-1/2" green dot strip, right sides together with the top row. Sew the two pieces together on the top edge only. Press. Fold along the seam, wrong sides together, aligning all the raw edges. Repeat for the bottom pocket.
- 6) Repeat Step 5 with the middle pocket and the 8-1/2" x 22-1/2" green dot strip.
- 7) Pin the top pocket to one 9-1/2" x 22-1/2" red peppermint strip, both with right sides up, aligning the bottom and side edges. Baste stitch down each side and across the bottom with an 1/8" seam allowance. Repeat with the bottom pocket and the remaining 9-1/2" x 22-1/2" red peppermint strip.
- 8) Repeat Step 7 with the middle pocket and the 11-1/2" x 22-1/2" red peppermint strip.

Putting it Together:

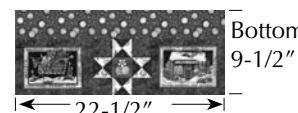
- 1) Sew the top, middle and bottom pocket panels together using a 1/4" seam allowance.
- 2) Sew one 1" x 29-1/2" yellow dot strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 1" x 23-1/2" yellow strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- 3) Sew one 3-1/2" x 30-1/2" blue treats strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 3-1/2" x 29-1/2" blue treats strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- 4) Layer and quilt the quilt top as desired.
- 5) To make the hanging tabs, fold each 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" strip in half lengthwise, right sides together. Sew down the long edges to make a 1" x 6" tube. Turn the tube right side out to make one tab. Repeat to make three tabs.
- 6) Fold each tab in half (wrong sides together) to measure 1" x 3". Align the raw edges of the tabs with the top raw edge of the quilt, positioning one on each end of the quilt top at least one inch from the side edges, and one in the center. Pin the tabs in place. Catch the bottom edges of each tab in the seam when attaching the binding. Bind as desired.
- 7) Sew vertical seams through the pockets and backing to divide the pockets into smaller sections, as desired.
